It can perform its functions without the permission of the administrator, and the performance of virtual machines operating on it works as good as the local installations.

It relies on CLI inputs to install and configure the system and doesn't rely on GUI-based interface tools. Even though it can run various operating systems, right now, it only supports Linux-based platforms.

5. Citrix Hypervisor: A Highly Scaleable Solution

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Citrix Hypervisor is an open-source tool; you can download and install it for free. However, it only offers a basic version for free, and it doesn't possess advanced features.

It offers sophisticated management tools, as well as the ability to automate and distribute live environments for its customers. It supports virtualized GPU and GPU pass-through, making it the best choice for virtualized CAD.

Moreover, it allows you to build virtual data centers that can handle both planned and unplanned data while maintaining the high levels of availability that your business demands.
